Reading and spelling:

Please listen to your child read at least five times a week. Even if it is just three pages a night. The Reading Wizard will be visiting our class and if your child has read at home at least three times and had their reading diary signed, they will win team points and a prize!

Please also help them to read the common exception words on class pages on the school website. These can be printed off and worked through each week.

Please begin at Set 1 and then progress to Set 2. Choose 4-5 words each week and use them as flashcards for your child to read by sight. These words cannot be decoded easily and are very common in our language so if they learn to read them instantly it will help them to build their fluency.

If they know 2/3 really well by the end of the week leave these out and replace with two more words. Every so often, revisit those previous words so they do not forget them.

You can play memory- matching games with them, hide them around the house or beat the timer on speed of reading them. Can your child put one of the words orally into a sentence?

Once your child can read them, choose 2-3 for them to practice spelling. This can be with coloured pens, using magnetic letters, in the bath with bath crayons, with paints, whatever you like. Try dictating a simple sentence with the word in or have your child create their own imaginative sentence. Have they remembered capital letter, finger spaces and full stops?

Extra Homework:

This is not essential homework but here if you would like any extra work for your child:

1. Funny Bones reading activities attached.
2. Maths – counting forward and back from any number to 100. Finding one more and one less than a number. Making the number with 1p coins or difference coins as a challenge.
3. Purple Mash. Your child has a Purple Mash login. This term, they will be learning to access the resources in school but I have created two geography tasks your child can complete. They are free to have a go at some of the other tools on there too.

Reading for Pleasure Book:

Every other Friday, your child will have opportunity to visit our school library to loan a book. This book is not to be read by your child but a book to be shared with your child. You can read it to them; they can join in phrases and talk about the events, pictures, story or information together. It is simply for enjoyment. The book will then need to be returned two weeks later for another book to be issued. Please also consider joining Garstang library for some new, exciting reads!

PE sessions may change throughout the year but currently we will have P.E. on a Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday morning. Please send in P.E. kits and trainers for those days, remembering to have your child's name in all their clothes.

We will hopefully visit Patty's Barn and their nature trail as part of our geography fieldwork (weather permitting – look out for details) and will have an online session with the National Archives looking at historical artefacts. It promises to be a very exciting term!
